The Department of Prevention and Community Health in The George Washington University School of Public Health and Health Services is seeking up to two energetic, resourceful scholars to serve as faculty members in the Maternal and Child Health program at the assistant or associate professor level, depending on experience and qualifications. The positions are for full-time, 12-month, tenure-accruing faculty appointments.

Basic Qualifications: Applicants must have an earned doctoral degree or equivalent in public health, social and behavioral sciences, maternal and child health, or health sciences. Applicants must possess experience and a record of scholarly accomplishments (publications in scholarly journals, conference presentations, etc.) in maternal and child health, nutrition, exercise and/or obesity research, clinical practice, asthma research, adolescent health, reproductive health, women's health, population health, HIV, or violence and injury prevention.

Preferred Qualifications: A record of successful teaching and advising at the graduate level, strong oral and written communication, and a demonstrated track record of design and evaluation of interventions and external research funding are preferred.

Letters of application should include a statement of interest, research and teaching experience and be accompanied by a curriculum vitae, and contact information including the names, mailing addresses and telephone numbers of three references and a reprint of a recent representative publication.
